**CIVIC ADDRESSING**  
By-Law No. 27-2017

**BEING** a by-law of the Municipality of Norfolk Treherne for numbering houses and buildings along streets, roads, or other public thoroughfares.

**WHEREAS** The Municipal Act Sec. 232(1) reads in part as follows:

232 (1) A council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people, and the safety and protection of property;
- d) municipal roads, including naming the roads, posting the names on public or private property, and numbering lots and buildings along the roads;


**AND WHEREAS** it is in the best interests of the Municipality of Norfolk Treherne to number the houses and buildings along certain streets, roads or other public thoroughfares located within the municipality.

**NOW THEREFORE** the council of the Municipality of Norfolk Treherne in Council assembled, enacts as follows:


1. **THAT** the houses and buildings along the streets, roads or other thoroughfares within the municipality be numbered in accordance with the Provincial Civic Addressing Standard.
2. **THAT** the Chief Administrative Officer, or his/her designate, be authorized and empowered to allocate numbers to the houses and buildings along the said streets, roads, or public thoroughfares.
3. **THAT** the minimum size of numbers to be used on buildings within the communities of Treherne, Rathwell and Lavenham be four (4") inches in height and be clearly visible from the public street. The registered owners of these properties are required to affix to their houses, buildings or on the front of their property facing the street, numbers to the property.
4. **THAT** the Municipality at least once per year will order new white on blue high visibility (300 mm x 350 mm) rural civic addressing signs for new buildings that have been identified and any signs that have been reported missing. Temporary signage is the responsibility of the property owner.

5. **THAT** this by-law rescinds all other by-laws that establish the order in which buildings are numbered within the Municipality of Norfolk Treherne and comes into full force and effect after final reading thereof.
